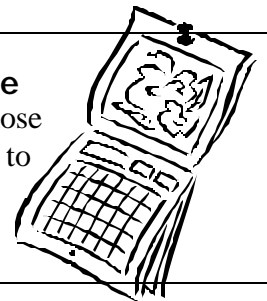

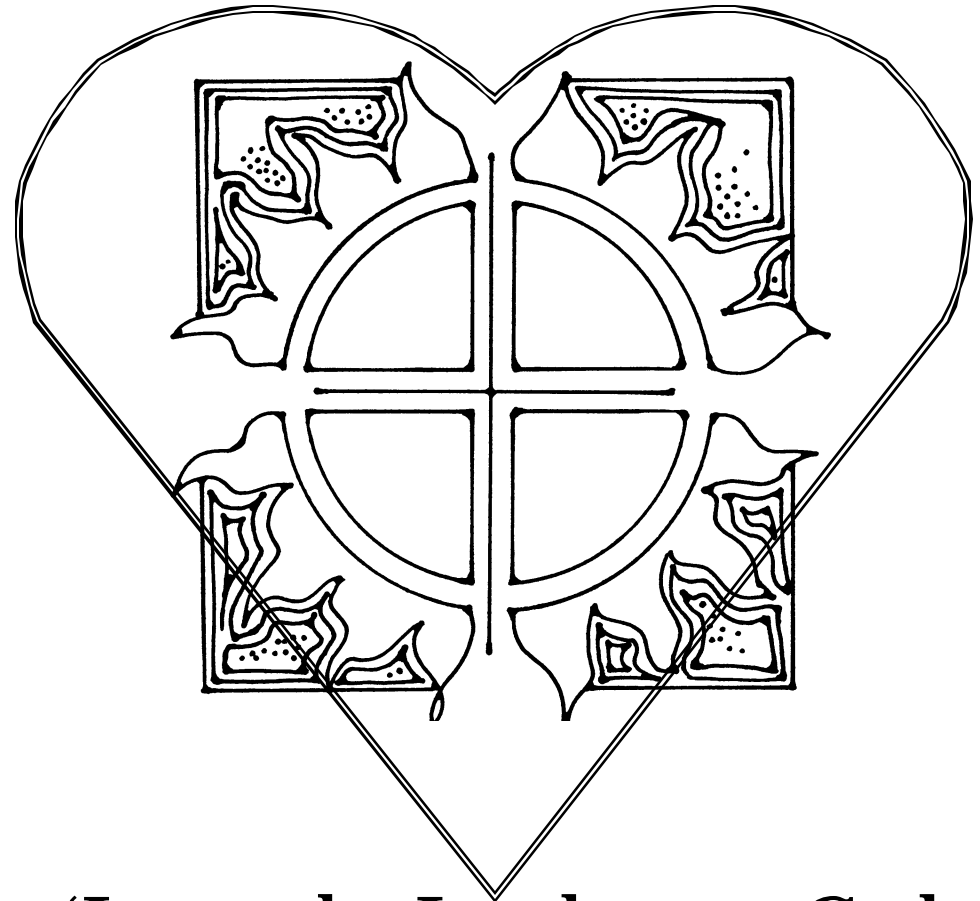

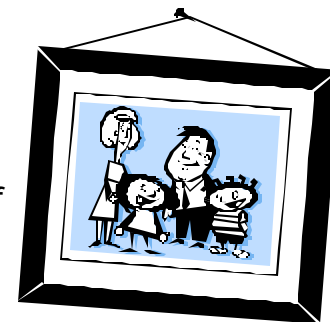

Tolmie Region Grain Ministry Update

Eleven Anglican Churches in the 'Tolmie Region' have taken up the 'Grain of the Month' Challenge (and set a target of one pound of the 'grain of the month' for each parishioner.) On the second Sunday of each month a designated "grain" is collected, providing the basis for meals served at 'Our Place' shelter on Pandora. The kitchens there provide meals for about 500 homeless people each day. The response to this challenge has been tremendous. On Thanksgiving Sunday, the Grain of the Month was Macaroni. In addition to the pasta, contributions of apples, kitchen and baking staples were requested. A total of 132 pounds of Macaroni, 103 pounds of Apples/ Oranges/ Pears/Tomatoes and 43 pounds of canned goods etc. were contributed. The total was 278 pounds.
